Dismantling Racism Book Discussions


Sunday, March 19th @ 3:00 PM in the Buxton Room

The Social Justice Team and Adult Education Team of First Church invite you to a book discussion of "*Dismantling Racism: Healing Separation from the Inside Out*" by the Rev. Terrlyn Curry-Avery, Ph.D.

Rev. Dr. Curry Avery is the pastor of Martin Luther King Jr. Community Presbyterian Church in Springfield. Her church was set ablaze at the end of 2020. She is also a licensed psychologist and author of several other books.

Have you been the recipient of meals cooked by someone who cares when going through a tough time?




